A student who has more than the allowed absences, <u>equivalent to two weeks of class</u>, or a student who has <u>missed 2 or more classes in a row</u> may receive a grade of "F" in the course.

Attendance Policy: A student who misses more than classes may receive a grade of "F".

Class roll is checked everyday at the beginning of class. Any student who comes in after roll is called is counted tardy. A combination of 3 tardies is an absence. Any student who misses any part of the class period can be counted <u>absent</u>. When you are absent, you are responsible for all material covered and for any assignments. An absence does not allow an assignment, made or due on that day, to be turned in late.

Homework: Homework will be assigned on MyMathLab. You are expected to complete these assignments by the due date. You have to purchase a MyMathLab passcode. The passcode comes bundled with a new textbook or you can buy it separately. I will work as many homework questions as possible in class but we may not have time to do them all. These assignments will be graded, it is very important that you work all the problems. **The key to success in this class is to thoroughly work and understand all homework assigned.** All tests will be primarily based on the homework.

Make-Ups: It is the total responsibility of the student to get any notes missed due to any kind of absence. There will be **NO** make-up tests. A student who has <u>advanced permission</u> from the instructor to miss a test for a legitimate reason (documented cases of illness, death in the family or other documented reasons deemed appropriate by the instructor) <u>may</u> substitute the final exam grade for the missing test grade. Any student who does not take a test at the scheduled time <u>without the prior consent</u> of the instructor will receive a grade of zero (0) on that test.

Academic Dishonesty: (Plagiarism):

I expect complete integrity from all students on all work submitted for evaluation. Students guilty of cheating on any test/exam will receive a grade of "zero" for that test/exam, at least, and may fail the course. If you do not understand a section after studying and working the assigned problems, please come to my office immediately the next day for help. Do not wait until the test. I am more than willing to help anyone who is having trouble, but each student needs to realize that the responsibility for learning the material lies on the student. Academic insurance, which allows students to expect the same education from all sections of a course, demands that a certain schedule be followed in this course. If there is not enough time on a certain day to answer all the homework questions, please come to my office for help. Keep in mind that college is not an institution where students receive all their education in the classroom. Most learning must happen individually (outside of class), so be prepared to work hard on your own.

Classroom behavior:

It is the policy of this college that classes be conducted in an environment that lends itself to learning. Therefore, it is expected that students behave in a manner so as to avoid disturbing the learning process for other students. Critical Thinking Defined

To think critically is to compare, to contrast, to analyze, to synthesize, and to see the world in fresh new ways. A critical thinker may make use of inference, analogy, metaphor, or experiment, or may recast an old idea in new and novel ways. A critical thinker has formed the reading habit and reads with a critical eye, recognizing that much that has been written is subject to interpretation and appraisal. A critical thinker is reflective and does not rush to judgment. A critical thinker is dispassionate but recognizes that emotion and sentiment often color human events and cannot be ignored. A critical thinker is able to weigh all available facts and to come to a defensible conclusion tempered by reason, the best available knowledge and any relevant experience. Finally, a critical thinker must know the limits of knowledge, must have a certain intellectual humility, must be flexible, must be tolerant and open-minded, and must be willing to admit error.

A Rationale for Critical Thinking

Critical thinking is essential to meet demands of a rapidly changing workplace, a workplace that esteems higher order thinking and creativity. To remain competitive with the rest of the world, to preserve a robust democracy, to maintain our quality of life, we must produce thinkers, innovators, creators, and leaders--- all dependent upon critical thinking.

Campus Emergency Policy:

- a. In the event the fire alarm is sounded, everyone must evacuate the building at once and in a calm and orderly fashion, using the nearest exit. In the event of a severe weather warning everyone must proceed immediately to the nearest designated shelter area which are marked by a small tornado symbol. All severe weather shelter locations are posted on the EGC website. Each student should, on the first day of class, determine the location of the nearest exit and the nearest designated shelter area for each of his or her classrooms. If you have difficulties locating either ask your instructor to assist you.
- b.
