While these assignments will not be graded, it is <u>very important</u> that you work all the problems. **The key to success in this class is to thoroughly work and understand all homework assigned.** All tests will be primarily based on the homework.

**Make-Ups**: It is the total responsibility of the student to get any notes missed due to any kind of absence. There will be **NO** make-up tests. A student who has <u>advanced permission</u> from the instructor to miss a test for a legitimate reason (documented cases of illness, death in the family or other documented reasons deemed appropriate by the instructor) <u>may</u> substitute the final exam grade for the missing test grade.
